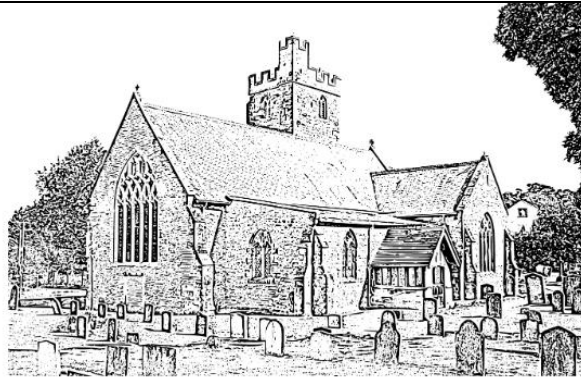
Celebrating 70 years serving our community

Residents and Councillors, Notice is hereby given that the annual meeting of residents of both Severn Stoke and Croome d'Abitot parish areas will be held on Wednesday **26th March 2025 at 7.30pm** at St Denys' Church, Severn Stoke village. This is a meeting of both parish electors organised by the joint Parish Council at the request of residents. Electors (residents) freely contribute to the agenda. This meeting is an opportunity to celebrate local activities and debate current issues. It is an opportunity for parishioners on the electoral roll to raise any matters of concern to them that relates to their local community. It would be helpful to have written notice of any matters to be raised but it is not essential. (Annual Parish Meetings must be held between 1st March and 1st June each year). This meeting will be held as a joint meeting of the parishioners of Severn Stoke Parish Area and of Croome d'Abitot Parish Area unless requested otherwise in writing in advance of this meeting.

a. **7.30pm start** with free tea and cake in hand.

i. Option for vote for a Chair.

If residents do not nominate a Chair, then the parish council will Chair as a courtesy.

ii. Introductions, points of order, apologies & declarations of interests.

b. **Open Forum.** Residents may raise any matter without notice.

- i. Bin layby A38 - size and capacity. Ask district council to empty more regularly. Bigger bins just get filled by fly tippers.

c. **Flood bund.** Any news that has reached the parish council.

d. **Devolution.**

Update on the forthcoming mandatory merger of district and county councils and implications for parish councils. Parish councils will come under pressure to take on more services – and yet we also see this as an unique opportunity. New service provision by the parish council will require funding via council tax. What do residents think about this? Come and have your say and ask questions.

What could a parish council take on if residents request it?

Bigger parish councils will be given the option to take over all libraries, public gardens, public toilets etc. Severn Stoke and Croome d'Abitot is on a much smaller scale. Nonetheless, this can be an opportunity if residents desire it. We could explore deeper parish council involvement in.....

- Mowing/maintenance of all verges.
- Extensions to the lengthsman scheme (which cares for drains, gullies and roadside paths on minor roads). This might include extension training to operate heavy machinery (diggers) in order to care out verge maintenance for example and, permits for roadside weed control.
- Maintenance on bridleways and public rights of way/sign posting and more controls over liaisons with landowners regarding legal care of styles/gates.

At this time, the parish council is not proposing to take over control of any flood bund features – if built – simply because so much remains to be made clear. At this time, the parish council has no jurisdiction over private land or church land and it is not envisaged that this would change.

2.	Co-options of new cllrs as required, as per the co-option policy. Currently there are 6 vacancies on the parish council. At the time of printing there had been 2 expressions of interest from eligible residents of the parish. If less candidates apply than the number of the seats, then matters progress with a brief welcome/introduction and a vote by a simple show of hands. New Cllrs sign the acceptance of office, receive a welcome pack and join the table as full voting members, noting that they may make declarations of interest for each and any relevant agenda item.
